RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HEALTH COMMISSIONER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF RETIRED PERSONS (AARP) FOR THE GRANT PROJECT OF COMMUNITY RESILIENCE OF PEOPLE OVER 50, LGBTQ AND PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS. BETWEEN JULY 5, 2024, TO DECEMBER 15, 2024. (REVENUE OF GRANT FUNDS AARP \$20,000.00)

WHEREAS, the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) provides grant funding to complete their community resilience requirements for residents 50+. Resilience is a dynamic and demonstrable outcome of an individual's, families, or community's ability to cope with uncertainty, access needed resources, and adjust or bounce back in an often-hazardous environment. Disasters disproportionately affect older people and vulnerable populations, including the LGBTQ populations. This funding will allow FCPH to educate and prepare seniors regarding risks, guidelines, planning and overall understanding of their unique needs during a disaster and supporting People Experiencing Homelessness (PEH) as well; and

WHEREAS, through support from the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP), Franklin County Public Health is an awardee for the AARP Livable Communities project nationally; which aligns with our Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) to increase awareness and emergency response coordination with a focus on the unhoused population needs; and Franklin County Public Health PHAB accreditation measurement 5.4; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Preparedness staff will oversee the deliverables outlined in the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) contract including: the purchase of rolling carts that will transport Go-kits. The Go-kits will contain items such as flashlights, batteries, first aid kits, stop the bleed torniquets, sanitation and hygiene supplies, ponchos, whistles, glowing light stick, pen, and paper, printed emergency checklists and educational flyers targeted at 50+ seniors with the AARP logo. FCPH will offer free emergency preparedness workshops and trainings to be promoted to the community, especially targeting those aged 50-plus. FCPH will purchase portable, lightweight tents to add to the Go-kits created specifically for the unhoused population; and
