RESOLUTION 24-106 July 9, 2024

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE HEALTH COMMISSIONER TO ACCEPT GRANT FUNDING FROM THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION (CDC) THROUGH ITS NATIONAL CENTER FOR INJURY PREVENTION AND CONTROL, OVERDOSE DATA TO ACTION: LIMITING OVERDOSE THROUGH COLLABORATIVE ACTIONS IN LOCALITIES (OD2A: LOCAL). (REVENUE of \$3,742,500.00)

WHEREAS, Franklin County Public Health (FCPH) has been awarded grant funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for a five (5) year period beginning (8/31/2023 – 8/30/2028) to use data to drive actions that reduce overdose morbidity and mortality in communities, with a primary focus on opioids and/or stimulants; and

WHEREAS, FCPH seeks to accept the grant award, to continue and expand its efforts in addressing the County's addiction crisis. FCPH will utilize a collective impact model to reduce drug overdose deaths, increase data capacity, implement a surveillance system for drug product and paraphernalia testing, increase linkages/retention to care, provide wrap around services for people who use substances, and decrease stigma across the County; and

WHEREAS, with this grant, FCPH will continue to implement new strategies to develop interconnected networks of care between the community, public safety, and health systems settings. An additional focus areas include harm reduction efforts, developing clinical education programs informed by local morbidity/mortality data, drug testing, and the Cascade of Care (CoC) model. Enhancing FCPHs' engagement of social determinants of health (SDOH) with priority populations; and

WHEREAS, through this funding, FCPH would be able to target populations such as people using illicit opioids and stimulants, people that recently experienced an overdose, Black males, unsheltered individuals, justice-involved individuals, and individuals with substance-use and/or mental health disorders in the new Americans and non-English speaking communities; and

WHEREAS, through this funding, FCPH has completed 318 harm reduction and stigma reduction trainings to the community, 273 individuals have been linked to care and educational resources, and FCPH currently has 70 clients enrolled in the peer support program; and

WHEREAS, this project aligns with PHAB Domains 4.1.1 (Foster cross-sector collaboration to advance equity), and 4.1.3 (Engage with community members to address public health issues and promote health), and the FCPH newly released Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Priority area Mental Health and Addiction Services).
